

IS DEAD AT ORCAS ISLAND

John Pike, a Puget Sound Pioneer, Goes to His Reward.

News was brought to The Times yesterday by S. B. Graham, of 116 Nob Hill Avenue, of the death at Orcas Island, near East Sound, of John Pike, for whom Pike Street in this city was named. Pike passed away on November 6, at the age of 88 years, 10 months and 12 days. He was buried at Orcas Island, which had been his home for a few months before his death.

John Pike was one of the pioneer residents of this city. From the recollections of C. B. Bagley, who knew Pike during the greater part of his residence here and of Mr. Graham, who knew Pike

for twenty years, it is learned that the latter came across the plains in 1852 with Dexter Horton, Daniel Bagley, A. S. Mercer, A. A. Denny and other Seattle pioneers. He settled first at Corvallis, Oregon, but in 1858 came to this city, then a log cabin settlement. He lived for a time on the northeast corner of Second Avenue and James Street, where the Smith Block has stood for a dozen years. He was the architect of the old University building, now the public library.

Pike moved away from Seattle fully thirty years ago. He was a mechanic and builder by trade, and always made

a good living, but acquired no fortune and died in moderate circumstances. An interesting feature in connection with his Seattle residence is that in company with his son Harvey he began the first canal between Lakes Union and Washington. They did much excavating on the low neck of land now designated as the portuge.

After leaving Seattle Pike went to Tacoma, and from that point he passed on successively to Astoria, Oregon, to Point Roberts, Washington, and then to Orcas Island. His wife, Helen Pike, died at Ilwaco seven years ago. His elder son. Harvey L. Pike, died at Providence Hospital about six years ago. A second son. Frank E. Pike, is now a painter in Blaine, this state.

L. D. Pike, 69 years old, a member of the family after whom Pike Street is named, died Friday of a heart attack at his home on Samish Island, near Mount Vernon. Funeral services will be held at 1 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the Huibush Funeral Home in Burlington, Skagit County.

Mr. Pike was the grandson of John Pike, Seattle ploneer, who built by hand the columns of the first University of Washington building which was situated at what is now Metropolitan Center. The columns now stand on the University campus.

L. D. Pike's father, Harvey Pike, lived in Third Avenue and Pike Street, where L. D. Pike was born in 1871.

Mr. Pike is survived by his widow, Ella M.; a son, Leonard G. Pike; a daughter, Mrs. J. C. Hansen, both of Samish Island; five granddaughters and one great-granddaughter; a sister, Mrs. O. I. Peterson, Astoria, Or.; a half-brother, Will Wood, Salem, Or., and two half-sisters, Mrs. Kate McAllister, Washougall, Clark County, and Mrs. Edith Russell) Seal Rock, Or.
